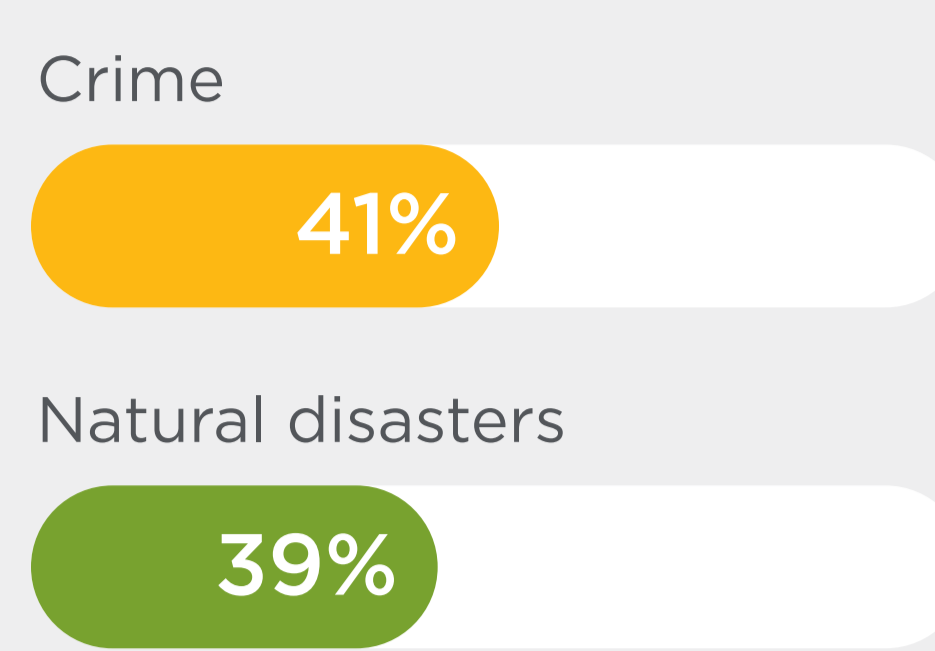

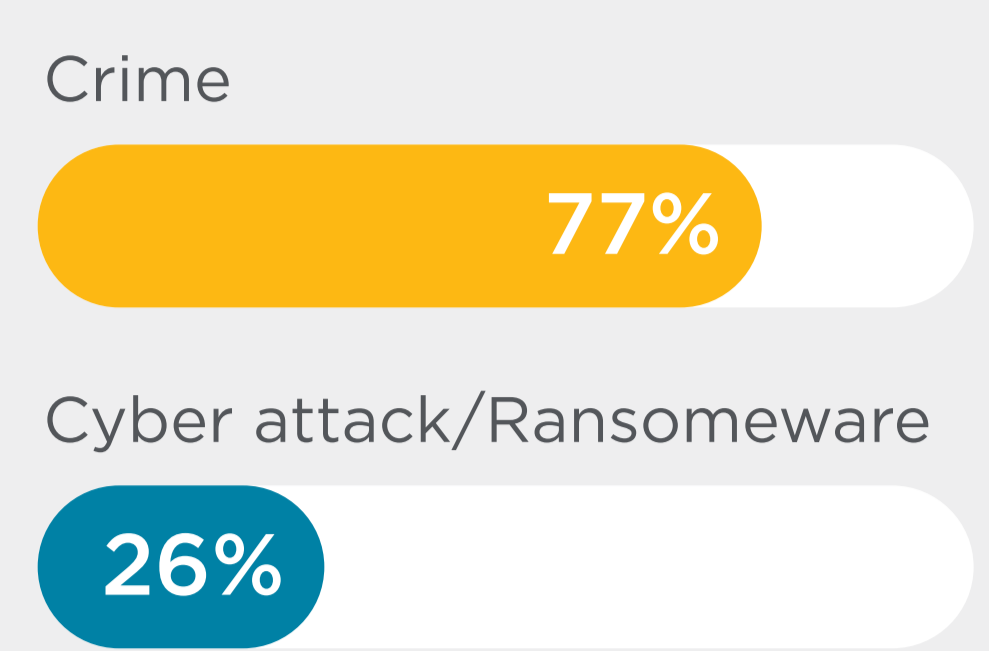
**Public and employee safety** was the top area impacted by these threats

## Risk is dynamic

with a single event often having cascading, unanticipated impacts.

## 51%

of federal leaders said their agency experienced unanticipated impacts “most of the time” or “always” as a result of the physical threats they experienced.

### The Unanticipated Impact of Theft



Reports of theft accounted for **28% of all crime reports** in San Francisco and **71% of all crime reports** in Los Angeles for 2022 and 2023 combined\*. The negative impact on communities is real:

- Public safety
- Local businesses
- Economic stability

## A Preparedness Gap Exists

## 96%

of federal leaders believe a proactive approach to threat mitigation is important or extremely important.

Yet only **6%**

said they are proactive about identifying risk.

## 72%

of state and local government leaders say the biggest risk in 2024 is crime.

Yet only **63%**

have a mitigation plan in place for this threat.

### What's causing the gap?

## 25%

of federal leaders said **lack of technology** is the biggest challenge or obstacle to improving resilience.

## 37%

of state and local leaders said **limited upskilling or training** creates the biggest gap and challenge in their agency's planning, response and recovery program.

## How to Close the Preparedness Gap

It's time to move away from a prevention-only approach to risk and adopt a **proactive approach** to physical threat mitigation built around rapid discovery and recovery. We call this resilience management.

### Here are 5 steps to help you close the preparedness gap:

- 1 Evaluate your current resilience program.
- 2 Identify your gaps.
- 3 Harness the value of data.
- 4 Invest in technology that enables you to be proactive and detect threats early.
- 5 Build the right framework so you can accelerate discovery to accelerate recovery.
